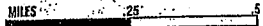


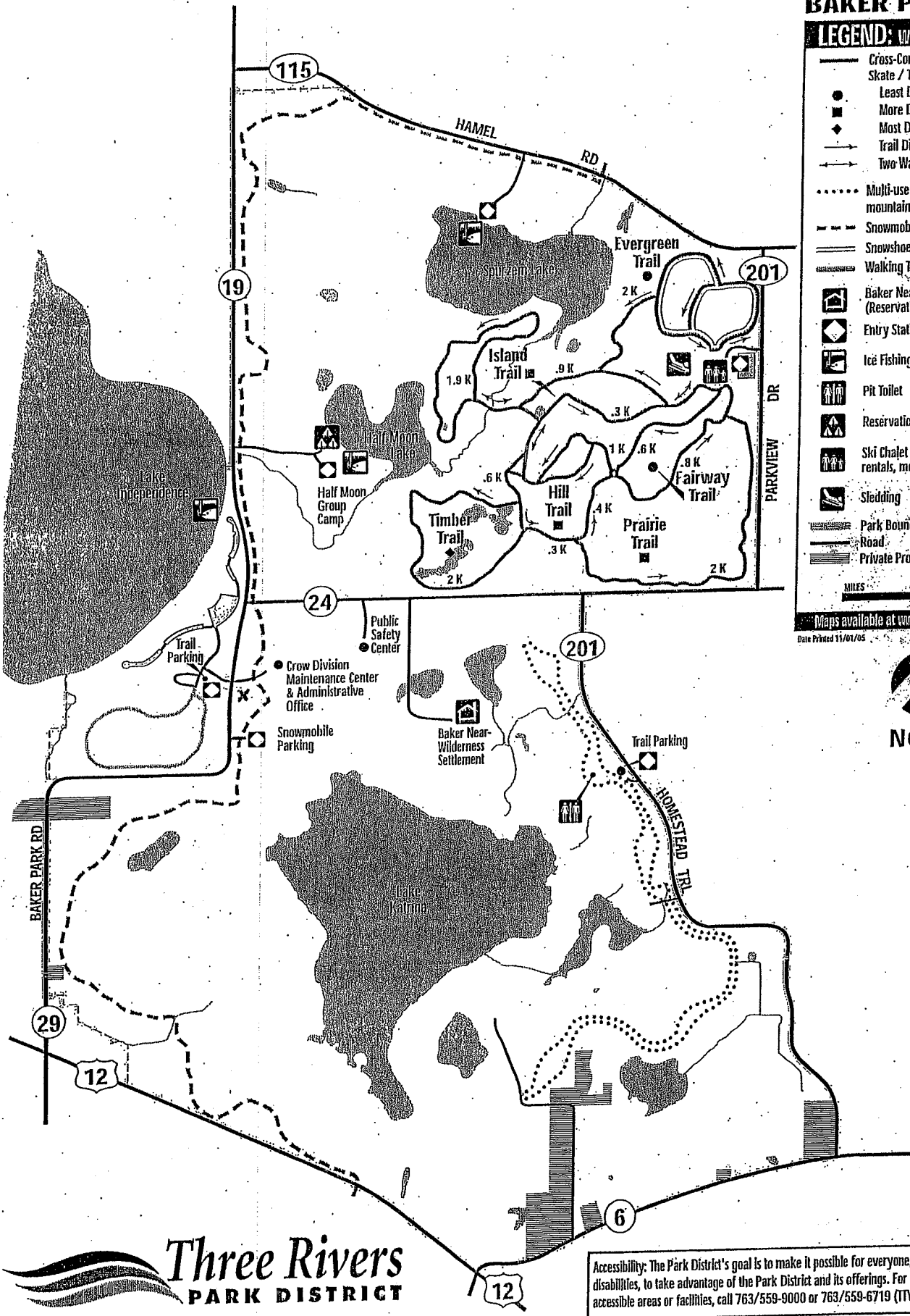
BAKER PARK RESERVE

HOW TO GET TO BNWS: Refer to the map to find your way to Co. Rd. 24 in Medina.

COMING FROM THE EAST: BNWS is 6 miles west of Hwy 55 on Co. Rd. 24. It is one mile west of 201 North and ½ mile west of 201 South. The entrance to BNWS is on the south side of Co. Rd. 24, directly across from the Marshview Campground.

COMING FROM THE WEST: BNWS is ½ mile east of Co. Rd. 19 on Co. Rd. 24. It is just east of the Public Safety Center and directly across from the Marshview Campground.

WHEN ARRIVING AT BNWS: Park in the paved parking lot. Walk to the kiosk area and follow the signs to the Baker Lodge.
